Senior Meals Program Seeking Volunteers

The Senior Meals Program of Lane County is facilitated by Senior and Disability Services, a division of the Lane Council of Governments. Their mission is: "To advocate for seniors and people with disabilities and provide them quality services and information that promotes dignity, independence, and choice."

Their programs are designed to meet the nutritional needs of adults who are sixty years or older. In our region, the programs consist of both Café 60, an in-

person dining room operated out of the Fern Ridge Service Center, and the Meals on Wheels program.

Café 60 has been in operation for more than 20 years, but the pandemic impacted the program, and they pivoted to pick-up only. Now organizers are trying to get Café 60 back the way things were pre-pandemic—not just a place to grab a hot meal, but a place to connect with other seniors face to face.

The success of Café 60 depends on a handful of volunteers. Coordinator Melisa Andrion said that they are currently in need of many more volunteers. "We are going to need a lot of help in the kitchen at Café 60," Andrion explained.

She said they are looking for about nine volunteers per day. Each shift is short—about two hours—so a volunteer may find that they have time to contribute more than once per week. But once per week, Andrion explained, is all that is required. That and a proof of vaccination status and a completed back-

The Café 60 volunteer role entails plating and serving already prepared foods. Little technical skills are required, just a willingness to help. Meals on Wheels volunteers can expect to drive their own vehicle and be compensated for mileage. Days of operation for both programs are Monday, Wednesday, and Friday.

Veneta doesn't always experience snow and ice, but it's good to know what to expect and how to be prepared if we do. Public Works Director Kyle Schauer said that with winter comes lots of rain in our area. He asks that residents consider the following when preparing for the season ahead:

Rain

- Clean your gutters
- Check your drainages ensuring they are clean of leaves and downed debris so that water can flow away from your residence
- Branches and leaves should be cleared, they are the main culprits for blocked drainages
- Blowing/sweeping leaves onto the street is prohibited, but if you bag them up the City will retrieve them on Tuesdays and Thursdays as time allows

Freezing Temps

- Remove and limb hazardous trees in the fall—Call the City first as a permit may be necessary to remove a hazardous tree
- Caulk around your windows and doors as needed
- Insulate exposed exterior piping to prevent bursts
- If you suspect a water leak, call the City for assistance shutting your water off
- For power outages, call your electric company (EPUD or Lane Electric)
- Prepare an emergency kit for outages lasting several days

Snow

- Have a snow shovel and windshield scraper handy
- Sign up for storm alerts on your smartphone
- Watch for school closures or delays and give extra time for commuting
- Drive with caution—the City plows the streets at 3-4 inches of snow accumulation
