
Parade became "Lights on Broadway," just for the year. That event alone drew more than 1,200 carloads of visitors to downtown.

merce's Gina Haley-Morrell. "It did my heart good to see smiling families singing Christmas carols and children wishing their neighbors a Merry Christmas."

Best Wishes Councilor Kenney

The City of Veneta bids farewell to City Councilor Calvin Kenney, and thanks him for more than 10 years of service to the City. Mr. Kenney served two terms on the City Planning Commission and the Budget Committee from 2011 through 2017, advancing such projects as the Ap-

pegate Landing III, the Backyard Chicken Ordinance, and the growth of Medical Marijuana Dispensaries.

On Nov. 13, 2017, he was sworn in to fill a partial-term City Council seat that opened when Thomas G. Laing stepped down. At that time, Kenney also resigned his po-

sition on the City's Planning Commission and his seat on the Budget Committee. With his term as Councilor expiring on Dec. 31, 2020, Kenney declined to run for re-election.

A nine-year resident of Veneta, Kenney's priorities for the City were

Rate Increase

Beginning January 1, the City of Veneta will implement increases in both water and sewer rates. Such increases are necessary to meet the debt service obligations incurred to build the pipeline to carry water from EWEB's infrastructure in Eugene to Veneta, keep pace with the costs of maintaining and repairing the water system and accumulate sufficient amounts to fund needed system expansion.

These incremental increases for water are likely to continue through 2022. "The City is ahead of schedule in paying off the pipeline bond," ex-

plained Finance and Administrative Services Director Caitlin Hippler. "In 2022, a consultant will once again evaluate the water rates and assess the financial needs for the City to both maintain the current water system and support future growth."

The base residential bill for combined water/wastewater will increase \$4.22 from \$72.34 per month to \$76.56, with commercial users rising \$4.62 from \$88.55 to \$93.17. All changes will be reflected on the January 2021 bill. Water base rates for residential, commercial, and bulk water
