

Murphy's Law and Your February Utility Bill

Sometimes things go wrong at just the worst time. For example, in January water rates increased \$0.07 per gallon for Tier 1 consumption levels. Then Murphy's Law kicked in because also in January we experienced an issue with our billing software. Taken

together, these two events resulted in your January bill being under-billed, by less than a dollar in most cases. We apologize for the error. We've identified what went wrong and made changes to prevent it from happening again.

On your February bill you'll notice a Balance Forward reflecting that under-billed amount. The Balance Forward is not an error on your part and it doesn't trigger a late fee. Again, it'll probably be less than a dollar depending on how much water you used. As always, if

City Loosens Parking Rule to Grow Downtown Veneta

Over the last 15 years Veneta created a downtown environment at W. Broadway that includes a community service center, restaurants, and open spaces for special events like the Downtown Farmers' Market, the Harvest Festival, and in recent years a Retail Pop-Up Market. The downtown district is meant to be a

community gathering center, a place where citizens share small town life and celebrate our community.

However, we haven't seen private investment in downtown retail spaces take off, yet. One potential barrier was the city's off-street parking requirement that sometimes required up to 60% of a property be devoted to

parking. That makes it difficult for a developer to invest in downtown Veneta if there's only 40% of the property that they can earn rent from.

Meanwhile, there are about 100 on-street parking spaces on W. Broadway and its cross-streets between Territorial Hwy and 5th Street. That includes the city's new 16

space public parking lot behind American Market. All this parking is within walking distance of the downtown district, and most existing buildings have their own parking.

To encourage downtown development, effective February 25th the City Council lowered this potential barrier to down-

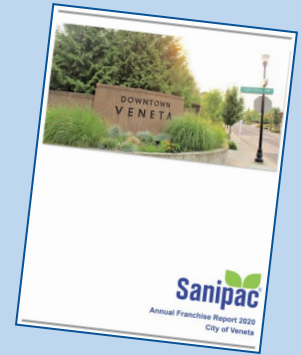
town investment by no longer requiring off-street parking for commercial properties on W. Broadway. This will give property developers a better chance at making a downtown project pencil out with more space to

rent to restaurants, shops, or offices.

The parking waiver does not remove the requirement to provide bicycle parking. Additionally, if any off-street parking is provided, ADA-compliant parking must also be provided.
