HOW TO COMPOST AT HOME

There are many different ways to make a compost pile; we have provided the following for general reference. Helpful tools include pitchforks, square-point shovels, & water hoses with a spray head. Regular mixing or turning of the compost & some water will help maintain the compost.

- Select a dry, shady spot near a water source for your compost pile or bin.
- Add brown & green materials as they are collected, making sure larger pieces are chopped or shredded.
- Moisten dry materials as they are added.
- Once your compost pile is established, mix grass clippings & green waste into the pile & bury fruit & vegetable waste under 10 inches of compost.

YARD DEBRIS RECYCLING

Place in your grey yard debris cart anything that grows above the ground including: raw fruits and raw vegetables, coffee grounds, (no protein), grass, leaves, branches up to 4" in diameter, brush, fruit tree discards, and plant vegetation

CLOSE THE LID

120 LBS LIMIT

NO DIRT OR ROCKS

NO BAGS

NO PET WASTE

NO POISON OAK

In the City limits of Veneta, yard debris will be picked up weekly during the months of April, May, and November.

COMMINGLE RECYCLE INSTRUCTIONS:

All recycling must be clean! Separating recyclables from your trash reduces the amount of waste that ends up in landfills, saves energy and reduces emissions!

INCLUDE ONLY THE FOLLOWING ITEMS:

Flattened Cardboard Boxes and Egg Cartons

Excludes frozen food packaging, gable top cartons, and waxed cardboard.



Newspapers, Magazines, Junk Mail, Office Paper, Paper Scrap

Clean paper only.



Milk Jugs and Drink Bottles

Empty and rinse all containers. No food or liquid residue. No lids.



Pop Cans and Food Cans

Empty and rinse all cans. No food or liquid residue. No lids.
