"They're both younger deputies newer in patrol and both are very active. Deputy Santini is a field training officer, so he trains other deputies. Deputy Warner is Spanish-speaking and has experience as a medic for a Swat Team," said Sgt. Ware.

Deputies Warner and Santini join Deputies Kenny Clark and Evan Meyers. The new deputies enjoy a wider range of responsibilities than they did in their previous roles, which lends to

their experience as deputies.

"They are both able to do a lot more than when in main office patrol. They can handle the call from beginning to end and can see a case all the way through. They're both strong deputies, do good investigations, and reports. They're good additions out here," explained Sgt. Ware.

The Annual S.A.N.T.A (Sharing Among Neighbors Toy Appeal) Giveaway is happening again this year at the Veneta Elementary School gym. President Monica Crawford says the giveaway has grown significantly in the twenty-six years that she has been involved.

"It got so popular over the years. It started with us just gathering donations of used toys and books, cleaning the item up and distributing them. Today we don't do used toys anymore. We never really know what to expect. It's a little different year to year, but we always have enough," said Crawford.

Participants are presented with different stations, such as teenagers, preteens, sporting goods, bicycles, stuffed animals, baby/toddler, and books. Bicycles are donated by Sanipac. ## Department Updates

### ADMINISTRATION

- The City started an electronic document retention initiative to convert city public records to electronic format. Our goals for this initiative are to minimize the space needed for document storage and make city documents more available to the public through the city website. 
- The City received our cybersecurity penetration test results and we scored pretty good. There are only three areas that need attention. Nothing rose to the level of an emergency remediation, so we'll review the devices/vulnerabilities in question and get those addressed. 
- Lane County received a \$86,743 grant from the Oregon Department of Emergency Management to fund updates to EOPs (Emergency Operations Plans) for cities and fire districts throughout Lane County. Local partners include Veneta and Lane Fire Authority. We'll update Veneta's current EOP that was completed in 2016 in partnership with Lane Fire Authority. The grant runs from October 2023 to September 2025. 
- Emerald People's Utility District (EPUD) recently celebrated its 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. In 1982, the part of Veneta then served by Pacific Power (the other part served, then and today, by Lane Electric Co-op) was the only city out of six that voted to go with the upstart people's utility district and leave Pacific Power! The unofficial results showed that 284 Veneta residents voted to go with EPUD while 255 voted to stay with Pacific Power, a difference of 29 votes. Cheers to EPUD and the "Veneta 29"! 


### COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

- The City recently received a bill for just under \$1,200 for the asbestos testing, sanitation/fluids removal, and landfill disposal of an abandoned 1991 Skyline Weekender RV/Trailer that was tagged and towed from Jack Kelley Drive in June. The RV was registered to an Oakridge resident. We've been lucky so far in that usually an RV gets moved, but this cost is something that we'll need to budget for going forward if we see more RV/trailers coming to town. 

### ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

- Vibrant Veneta's 3<sup>rd</sup> mural project is complete! The panoramic mural on W. Broadway at Broadway Mini-Storage will get an anti-graffiti coating applied soon. At the suggestion of passers-by, they'll be adding solar-powered lighting for the mural.
- Our RAIN Catalyst partners have several events coming up to connect with local businesses. They're planning a Business Financial Fitness Bootcamp for entrepreneurs on December 1<sup>st</sup> with banking and bookkeeping panelists at the Fern Ridge Service Center. Additionally, there will be a Connecting Over Coffee meetup on December 13<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. at Our Daily Bread. 

### PUBLIC WORKS

- The Light Parade through downtown Veneta is at 7:00 p.m. on Thursday, December 7<sup>th</sup>. Plan to come out and see the floats, the fun, Veneta Mayor Keith Weiss, and Santa Claus! Helping out at the float staging area along Jack Kelley Drive is United Rentals donating two light towers and Bucks Sanitary Service donating portable restrooms for parade participants. Thank you to United Rentals and Bucks! 



On Veterans Day, the Veneta Fern Ridge Chamber of Commerce, local Scout Troop 50, American Legion Post 61, and Veterans of Foreign Wars Jack Kelley Post 9448 hosted a memorial at City Park.

The event featured Veneta City Councilor Pat Coy giving the Invocation, Mayor Keith Weiss reading a Proclamation, former City Administrator Ric Ingham honoring WWII Wake Island combatants, Neighborhood Watch Captain and retired Navy Lt. Cmdr. Dave Quirk giving the keynote address, and current City Administrator Matt Michel leading those gathered in singing our National Anthem. Freedom Dogs (hot dogs) were free for everyone!

## Preparation Tips for Winter

Veneta doesn't always experience snow and ice, but it's good to be prepared, just in case. Residents may want to consider the following in advance of the wet and wintry season ahead.

### Heavy Rain

- Clean your gutters
- Check your drainages ensuring they are clean of leaves and downed debris so that water can flow away from your residence. Branches and leaves are the main culprits for blocked drains.
- Blowing/sweeping leaves onto the street is prohibited, but if you bag them up the City will retrieve them on Tuesdays and Thursdays as time permits from October through January

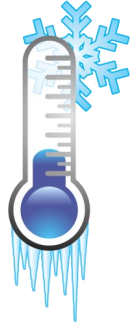
### Snow

- Have a snow shovel and windshield scraper handy
- Sign up for storm alerts on your smartphone
- Watch/listen for school closures or delays
- Know that the City plows the streets at 3-4 inches of snow accumulation
- Beware of black ice, especially on rural roads
- Allow extra time for commuting

### Freezing Temps

- Remove and limb hazardous trees before winter (call the City first as a permit may be necessary to remove a hazardous tree)
- Caulk your windows and doors as needed
- Insulate exposed exterior piping to prevent bursts
- Allow a small amount of water to run periodically through your faucets to prevent freezing
- If you suspect a water leak, call the City for assistance shutting off your water
- For power outages, call your electric company (EPUD or Lane Electric)
- Prepare an emergency kit for outages lasting several days

And most importantly...enjoy the peace of mind that comes from being prepared for every type of weather event!
