

2024 Veneta Election: Meet the Mayoral and Council Candidates

The 2024 General Election is Tuesday, November 5th. On the ballot are Alexa Benson and Robbie McCoy for Veneta City Mayor. Running for City Councilor positions are Anthony “Pat” Coy, David Voltz, and Maureen Wright. There are two open City Councilor seats available.

All members of the City Council, including the Mayor, volunteer their time and are responsible for passing laws, creating policies, and guiding budget decisions. They serve a 4-year term, attend City Council meetings

15th Annual Harvest Festival Draws Record Crowds

On Saturday, September 14th, downtown Veneta buzzed with activity as it hosted the 15th Annual Harvest Festival, reported to be the largest since its inception in 2009. This popular event serves as a vital fundraiser for Mid Lane Cares, which oversees essential community programs like the Love Project Food Pantry, S.A.N.T.A., and Senior Meals. The City supports Mid Lane Cares by leasing the Fern Ridge Service Center for just one dollar a year, with pro-

ceeds from the festival helping to fund operational costs and community initiatives.

This year’s festival featured beloved activities from past events, including the Veneta Fern Ridge Chamber of Commerce Chili Cook-off, the Kiwanis Kruise-in, a variety of food trucks, live music, and a record-breaking 94 vendor booths. The festivities kicked off with a pancake breakfast at the Fern Ridge Service Center, benefiting

Department Updates

ADMINISTRATION

- For the 11th straight year, the City of Veneta received a Certificate of Recognition for Budget Preparation from the Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA). The GFOA judges the City's budget document on criteria that include how clearly budget priorities are stated, how well department activities are summarized, and more generally how well it easily communicates important budget information for community members. Congratulations Finance Director Tim Gaines, Management Analyst Jacob Thode, and Administration Supervisor Ann Haxby on a job well done!
- At long last the Federal Highway Administration has signed-off on the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) analysis document for the Highway 126: Veneta to Eugene project.



There is a QR code below that will take you to the Oregon Department of Transportation's (ODOT's) project webpage where you can access supporting technical reports. ODOT still doesn't have dedicated funds to construct any portion of the project, but they applied for a federal grant for work on the west-end near Veneta. Fingers crossed!



PUBLIC WORKS

- The Territorial Park pickleball courts are getting the court top coating applied as that project starts to wrap up. The City is planning to have a ribbon-cutting event at the courts in November. Follow the City's Facebook page and website to catch the details.
- The western edge of the Bark & Whistle off-leash dog park will extend an additional 30 feet west beyond what was planned to better accommodate the terrain. Within this new area, all blackberries and other invasive vegetation were removed. The contractor will prepare the area for grading, and seed all the disturbed areas with a lawn seed mix.



COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

- Last month there was an RV abandoned in the street that the Veneta Sheriff's Deputy had towed. The bill for the tow was around \$800, not including the storage fee. There will also be a bill for the disposal of the RV. The City added funds to this year's budget in anticipation of this happening more frequently, as it has throughout Oregon.
- Last month was the annual City Lot 400 unsanctioned camp sites clean-up before the rainy season. This year we had four volunteers and a camper helping out. The volunteers are getting pretty good with getting the job done in less than two hours. It wasn't too bad this year and having a wide clear path onto Lot 400 really helped.



ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

- Travel Lane County and the FlyEug team are expanding their destination marketing presence at the Eugene Airport. The newest video content is playing on the screens in the baggage claim area with several 10-second videos that feature Lane County communities, including Veneta! Take a selfie in front of the video and send it to us to show your Veneta pride!



PUBLIC SAFETY

- Seven local businesses spoke during the Public Comment portion of the September 9th City Council meeting to share their collective concern with property theft at construction sites and outdoor storage areas. They asked the City Council to address the issue at their October meeting. Staff followed-up on their comments by acknowledging their concern, sharing the City's efforts to find options for the City and the businesses to explore, and the City's commitment to support our local businesses.

the American Legion Post 61.

The Silver Threads quilt group raised over \$400 through a quilt giveaway, generously donating the proceeds back to Mid Lane Cares. The Kiwanis Kruiise-In also saw impressive turnout, with over 120 cars, two boats, and a motorcycle participating. Funds raised during the Kruiise-In will support local youth programs and the OHSU Doernbecher Children's Hospital.

In the chili cook-off, the S.A.N.T.A. Project took home first place, followed by West Lane Charter School, which



won both second place and the People's Choice award. Orchid Health secured third place, while Oregon Empire Real Estate earned accolades for best booth presentation.

City Administrator Matt Michel remarked, "The Harvest Festival brings people out to enjoy and spend time with each other. It's something to look forward to every year." The Veneta Park Board also participated, hosting a free tree raffle for six ornamental trees, continuing their partnership with the City for a second year in promoting environmental awareness.

DITCH MAINTENANCE

"The flow of water should not be impeded in any way," says Public Works Director Kyle Schauer.

When drainage ditches get blocked it causes them to overflow, leading to flooding and major damage to roads, landscaping and nearby houses.

Depositing leaves or other debris in a drainage way or street is a violation of Veneta Municipal Code Chapter 13.15.010.

Residents should be aware that some properties contain protected wetlands. Special care should be taken when removing vegetation.
