- Leave your pet at home. Fireworks displays can be disorienting and frightening to most pets.



- Leave your pet in an area where they feel safe, comfortable and sheltered from the outside noise.
- Never leave pets outside and unattended. Even in a fenced yard, panic can lead to injured pets, if they attempt to escape. Make sure that your pet is wearing current identification. In the unfortunate event that your pet is lost, an updated

Department Updates

ADMINISTRATION

- As the Veneta Park Board swings into summer event season, the City will be creating Facebook event pages as a central location for event information. The first event is Veneta 4ths. Come celebrate the Fourth of July with your neighbors from 3-7 p.m. at Veneta City Park!
- Lane Fire Authority is hosting a retirement event for Lt. Tressa Miller on Friday, July 11th at 3 p.m. in the Veneta Station. Tressa currently serves as the Veneta Park Board Chair and gives a lot of her time to the Veneta and Fern Ridge community. Stop by and congratulate her on a career of care and service!



PUBLIC WORKS

- The City awarded the Bolton Hill Sports Complex Phase 1 construction project to Ordell Construction. There was a total of six bidders, which was a good response rate. The bids generally centered around the \$4.5 million to \$5 million mark. Construction will start this summer!
- The Veneta Fern Ridge Chamber of Commerce's Flowers on Broadway is back and beautiful! The Chamber took on the responsibility for hanging the banners, with the daily watering being done by the Public Works Team. Those flower baskets will get bigger and better throughout the summer. High Fives to the Chamber and the Public Works Team!
- We received a progress update from city engineer Civil West on the development of the Wastewater Facilities Plan (WWFP) and concept design to address the City's current and future wastewater treatment needs, ensure regulatory compliance, and support long-term system reliability and capacity. They've assessed existing infrastructure and its limitations, identified alternatives, and developed recommended improvements consistent with state and federal guidelines. Currently, they're gathering cost estimates and design parameters with vendors to finalize detailed discussion on alternatives, costs, and the suggested design alternative. Once complete, the WWFP will be subject to review by City



Staff, the City Council, and then Oregon DEQ. Acceptance of this document will lend itself to the concept design phase. The early estimated cost is almost \$38 million.

- The City received some good news about the Middle-Mile Fiber project. Lane County required an environmental survey for any protected plant species be done along the 1.75 miles of K.R. Nielsen Road where fiber would be hung on poles. We had concerns about State-protected Bradshaws lomatium, but we heard from the contract biologist that after two separate site visits, there were no rare species found! We'll work with Douglas FastNet to get the work done and offer that fiber to any internet service providers that want to serve Veneta. More providers should lead to more competitive pricing.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

- Lane County Transportation reached out last week to update the City on some promising project activity in our area. Territorial Highway from Fir Grove to Clear Lake was elevated as a safety priority based on crash data in Lane County's Transportation Safety Action Plan update process underway. They're drafting concepts for shoulder widening of that section and a roundabout at Territorial/Clear Lake. Also, Warthen Road was elevated as a Safety priority, so they'll draft concepts for a sidewalk project from Territorial to Falcon, which the school district previously requested. Look for community meetings this summer on these draft concepts. If there's community support on the concepts, then those designs would be ripe for future grant funding for construction.
- Separately, the City met with Lane County Transportation and ODOT to talk about future options for the Jeans Road & Territorial Highway intersection and the Territorial & OR126 intersection. Here's ODOT's perspective: The intersections are currently 300 feet apart, which is less than the 350-foot minimum called for in the Oregon Highway Plan. The length of the existing southbound left-turn lane at OR126 is substandard because it can't store the volume of traffic and can't be extended into the Jeans Road intersection.





Public Safety Fee Adjustment, July 1, 2025

This is a reminder that you will see an increase to the public safety fee on your July Utility Bill. Per Resolution 1442, the monthly rate will increase from \$6.00 to \$9.00. The increase is to cover funding our 4 Lane County Sheriff deputies and 1 sergeant.

We're just starting the conversation with ODOT and the County, but it's good to know that ODOT sees the bigger problem too, so that they can be part of the solution.

- Veneta-Elmira Multi-Use Path project update: We received promising news last week that the Oregon Bike/Ped Advisory Committee recommended \$5,053,000 of Oregon Community Paths grant funding! That's funding for half of the Project starting at Suttle Road. While we probably shouldn't start celebrating yet, I think it's okay to start stretching out your muscles just so you don't hurt yourself celebrating if the funding does come through. 😊 This recommendation still needs to be approved by the Oregon Transportation Commission who may either fund this year some of the recommended projects based on project readiness and available funds, or next year, again, depending on funds. Two years ago, the Project also made the list but tied with two other projects at the bottom of the

priority list, and didn't get funded due to a lack of funds. At least this year the Project landed at Priority #8 out of twelve.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

- Lane County sent us their required annual Enterprise Zone report for 2025. Veneta has one Enterprise Zone property tax abatement participant, Holte Manufacturing. Holte had \$1,296,910 of property that was placed into the Enterprise Zone property tax deferral program last year. The County listed the taxes that would have been imposed on that property as \$22,542. The Enterprise Zone economic development incentive program is a statewide, temporary, property tax exemption designed to encourage companies to invest in production improvements. After three to five years the value of that property can go on the tax roles to support the local community.



City Council Adopts 2025-2026 Budget Effective July 1st

The Veneta City Council adopted an annual budget at the end of June. The biggest ticket item is Phase 1 of the Bolton Hill Sports Complex Upgrade project at about \$5 million dollars. Phase 1 will upgrade the playing fields. Ordell Construction will start construction this summer. The City is pursuing a grant for the Phase 2 playground on the westside of the park.

Summer Driving Safety: Protecting Kids, Pets, and Pedestrians

Summer brings more people outdoors—especially children on bikes, dog walkers, and pedestrians. Drivers should stay alert in neighborhoods and near parks. Kids on bikes may swerve or ride unpredictably, so slow down and give them extra space. At intersections, always check twice for cyclists and pedestrians before proceeding.

Parents can help by teaching kids bike safety: always wear helmets, ride on the right side of the road, and use hand signals. Make sure bikes are the right size for each rider and in good working condition. Encourage children to make eye contact with drivers before crossing streets.

Dog walkers are often out during

cooler hours, watch for dogs on leashes that may extend into the road.

In Oregon, drivers must stop and remain stopped for pedestrians in any crosswalk—marked or unmarked—when the pedestrian is in their lane, an adjacent lane, or within six feet of the lane into which they are turning. This includes when any part of the pedestrian or their equipment, such as a stroller, wheelchair, or cane, enters the roadway with intent to cross. Yielding isn't optional, it's the law and it saves lives. Stay distraction-free and drive slowly in residential areas.

A little caution goes a long way. Together, drivers and parents can make summer safer for everyone.

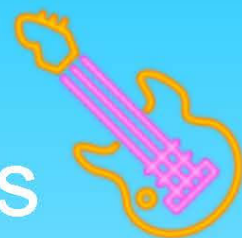
